WHAT SUPPORT AND SERVICES ARE AVAILABLE TO CAREGIVERS?

Information and Referral:

Program staff are available to provide information about Family Caregiving resources on the Cape and Islands. They also work to raise community awareness of caregiver concerns and needs.

One-on-One Assistance:

A Caregiver Outreach Specialist and a Family Support Coordinator can provide one-on-one assistance with services such as in-home interviews of caregiving needs, and resource access for both caregiver and carerecipient.

Education, Training and Support:

A variety of training, support, and educational programs as well as programs for stress relief and respite are available through grants funded under Title III E of the Older Americans Act. Elder Services awards and monitors these grants and can connect caregivers to the services and supports they provide.

Did You Know . . . YOU DON'T HAVE TO DO IT ALONE

- Nearly one in four families is involved in caregiving.
- Almost half of all caregivers provide at least 8 hours of care each week, another quarter spend 20 hours per week.
- Two out of three caregivers are employed-52% of these are working full-time, 12% part-time.
- 95% of elders receiving paid and unpaid care have family and friends involved in the care they receive.
